SCHOOL OVAL REDEVELOPMENT

During the upcoming school holidays, the school's main oval will begin to have major redevelopment works undertaken. The major works will involve the:

- removal of the existing poor-quality top soil,
- installation of drainage,
- installation of new soil structure,
- installation of a watering system
- laying of new turf on the oval

The works will occur throughout Term 4. All going to plan, it will be ready for use by the start of the 2023 school year. The redevelopment will allow for year-round playability of the oval for the students.

FOOTY COLOURS DAY




ATHLETICS

BALLARAT TRAMWAY MUSEUM


