SCHOOL OVAL REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Following the recent rain delays, major works on the school oval is now able to be resumed. The major works undertaken so far include the removal of the poor-quality top soil and the installation of drainage. The next stage will involve the installation of new soil structure, installation of a watering system and laying of new turf on the oval surface. The works will continue throughout Term 4. It is anticipated that, all going to plan, the project should be completed and ready for use at the start of the 2023 school year. The successful redevelopment will allow for year-round playability of the oval.
