NAPLAN 2024

Students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be involved in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) this term. The assessments are completed online (except for Year 3 Writing which is completed on paper), which allows them to be adaptive and give a more accurate measure of student progress.



The dates and assessments are as follows:

Wednesday 13th March - Writing

Thursday 14th March - Reading

Friday 15th March – Conventions of Language

Monday 18th March – Numeracy

Tuesday 19th March – Catch-Up for students who missed assessments

We have included opportunities for students to catch-up on some of the assessments that are missed due to absence.

The online assessments will be completed on the student's Chromebook and all students require a set of headphones. Students who have adjustments to their usual assessments, that fit under the NAPLAN guidelines, will have these same adjustments available when completing the assessments. We encourage all students to view NAPLAN assessments as an opportunity to show what they know and not to allow this testing to cause any stress or concern.

STUDENT MEDICATION REMINDER

A reminder to parents that any medication that your child requires regularly at school (such as hay fever, pain relief, asthma medication etc) needs to be supplied from home. The school stocks of medication are for one off needs or emergencies. Thanks for your assistance with this.

OVERDUE LIBRARY BOOKS

I'm seeking parents' assistance to have a good look at home for missing school library books. We have over 350 student library books that were not returned last year. The non-return of books from last year effects your child borrowing ability in 2024 and impacts to books available for other students to borrow.
