#### **MOBILE PHONE & SMART WATCH PRACTICES**


St Thomas More Catholic Primary School recognises that modern society is characterised by many forms of

digital technologies. These technologies offer potential for enhancing learning but conversely also present risks to student wellbeing and to student development if not used appropriately. To balance the conflicting aspects of technologies, we support the use of school-based technologies (iPads and Chromebooks), but ban the use of smartphones and smartwatches during the school day. E.g. mobile phones, Apple watches, etc.

We continue to adopt Victorian State Government guidelines that all mobile phones and smartwatches in primary school must be handed to the classroom teacher to be stored during the school day. Students may only access them before 8:45am and after 3:15pm. Smartwatches (unless set to school mode) should not be with a student at all throughout the school day. If a parent needs to communicate with their child or relay an urgent message, please contact the office on 5334 2244. Alternatively, you may prefer to leave a message on your child's phone which they will see upon collection of the device at 3.15pm.



### Enrolment Information for Prospective 2025 Foundation (Prep) Students at Catholic Primary Schools in the City of Ballarat

# A single enrolment application process is in place for all families seeking Foundation (Prep) enrolment for the 2025 school year at a Catholic primary school within the City of Ballarat (see school list overleaf), including families with children already in one of the eleven schools. Note that information collected through the enrolment process is collated on a common database shared by the eleven schools.

Families seeking enrolment should follow the steps below to apply by Thursday 23 May 2024.

#### **Application Process**

- 1. Contact/visit the website of the school/s you are interested in enrolling your child at see school list overleaf.
- 2. Engage with the school's process for conducting information sessions or school tours
- 3. Complete the online Expression of Interest for Enrolment form by Thursday 23 May 2024 by visiting the <u>DOBCEL website</u> (click link or scan the QR code)

#### Important:

- You will be asked to indicate your first, second and third preference schools.
- You will be required to upload your child's Birth Certificate and Baptism Certificate (if applicable).
- If you are unable to access the online form, contact Danielle <u>enrollments@dobcel.catholic.edu.au</u> for assistance. Your query will be attended to as soon as possible.

## **Enhancing Catholic School Identity**

General instructions for survey completion for parents

**Thank you very much** for making time to participate in the Enhancing Catholic School Identity project. The purpose of this survey research is to gain meaningful insights into how your son or daughter's school views its Catholic identity today and how such identity might be shaped for tomorrow.

Everyone's input is important.

Your participation should take about **55 minutes.** It's best to finish the survey in one shot, without having to come back later.

Your responses are anonymous and your personal data is treated confidentially in accordance with ethical and legal guidelines.

Only you will be able to view your individual results and this can be done once you've completed the questionnaires.

#### Keep these best practices in mind:

- Answer spontaneously and don't overanalyse. Your input is more valuable if you respond with the first thought that comes to mind. Plus, you'll proceed faster.
- Choose the response that honestly matches your opinion. Don't hesitate to select "strongly agree" or "strongly disagree" if that's in fact how you feel.
- Respond as best you can to each question as it is worded. You may feel that some questions don't fully apply to your school environment. That's OK; just respond as best you can.

#### It's also helpful to keep in mind:

- ✓ Many questions ask you for two perspectives:
  - o "My son/daughter's school" as you actually see things today
  - o "My ideal school" as you would like to see things in the best future scenario
- ✓ Some questions might seem repetitive; but they're actually not. There's a scientific purpose behind the ways in which the questions are formulated. Every question counts.
- Trust that the survey as a whole will accurately capture your personal point of view. Even if you
  struggle to respond to some individual questions, it's important to complete the entire survey.
