Dear Families,

In our school assembly today, we reminded the students that ANZAC Day is a day to remember all Australians and New Zealanders who gave their lives in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping missions around the world. It is also a time to remember and thank all those who have served, and continue to serve, in the Australian and New Zealand armies. We will keep them all in our thoughts tomorrow on ANZAC Day.



Next week all schools across the Ballarat Diocese will be celebrating the 150 years of the Ballarat Diocese with Catholic Education Week, which will run from 29th April – 3rd May. This is a very significant occasion that will be marked by many celebrations across the Diocese and here at St Thomas More Catholic Primary School.







SPECIAL PERSONS DAY

As part of Catholic Education Week celebrations, we will be holding a Special Persons Day on **Thursday 2nd May** between 1.30 - 3.15pm. The format for the day is that "Special Persons" (parents, grandparents, friends etc) are invited to come into school at 1.30pm and wait outside in the school yard until the students come out at 1.45pm. Our "Special Persons" will then have time with the children outside. They may like to bring along some food to share. At 2.20pm the students and special people will come into the classrooms.



Students will have the opportunity to show their work to their special person/s and include them in activities within the classroom. At 2.40pm students and special people will make their way to the Multipurpose Room for Whole School Prayer led by the students in 3/4 Edwards class. The day will conclude at 3.15pm.

ANNUAL ATHLETICS DAY

Another great community event in Catholic Education Week is our annual Athletics Day. It will be held on **Friday 3rd May** at Llanberris Athletics Reserve, located in York St, East Ballarat. Students are required to be dropped off at the venue by parents /caregivers between 8:20 – 8:35am for a prompt 8:45am start. Students will need to bring snacks, lunch, drinks, sunscreen and a hat. If you are coming to join us for lunch or are bringing your child's lunch, we plan to have a break at approximately 11:20am. Students are timetabled to participate in a variety of events throughout the day and will move to each event in their age group. The sports day will conclude at 2:00pm, with students being dismissed from the site, under the care of their parents/caregivers. For those parents who have informed us through the Parent Access Module (PAM) that their child/ren will not be collected from the venue, their child/ren will return to school by bus with teachers. These students will be dismissed at the usual dismissal time of 3:15pm. A program for the day is being finalised and will be sent home very soon. Extra copies will also be available at the front reception desk.

INFORM AND EMPOWER

Beginning this term, we are pleased to be partnering with the *Inform and Empower Cyber Safety & Digital Wellbeing program*. This means that your child/children will be tuning in to live streamed incursions (with their teachers) that focus on healthy and safe digital habits. The incursion content is all written and delivered by qualified teachers who are endorsed by the eSafety Commissioner as a Trusted eSafety Provider.



These sessions aim to help children better navigate the online world and become more aware, clever, brave and kind. They will focus on topics including navigating unwanted contact, cyberbullying, help-seeking strategies, unsafe content, balancing screen time with "green time" and guidelines around sharing personal information. You will also be given resources to support conversations with your children at home. You will receive a concise "tip sheet" each term that outlines what your child learned about in class and how you might open-up these important conversations. See page 5 of the newsletter.

MOTHER'S DAY EVENTS

We have several Mother's Day events planned to celebrate the mothers and carers in our children's lives. On **Thursday 9th May**, the Parents and Friends Association is conducting a Mother's Day Stall for the students. All students will have the opportunity to purchase a gift for their mother/carer. All gifts are priced at \$5 each. Students are asked to bring along \$5 on the day to pay for their chosen gift. On the afternoon of **Thursday 9th May**, our Whole School Prayer will focus on Mother's Day. Parents are welcome to attend the Whole School Prayer. If you intend to attend, we ask that you are seated quietly and prayerfully in the Multipurpose Room by 2.50pm. The following day, **Friday 10th May**, our annual Mother's Day breakfast will be hosted by the Parents and Friends between 7:00- 8:45am. Egg and bacon rolls and fruit juice will be served to all. This year there will be no tickets required to attend the event, however, please be aware that breakfast service will most likely be very busy between 8am and 8.45am.

Enrolment Information for Prospective 2025 Foundation (Prep) Students

at Catholic Primary Schools in the City of Ballarat

A single enrolment application process is in place for all families seeking Foundation (Prep) enrolment for the 2025 school year at a Catholic primary school within the City of Ballarat (see school list overleaf), including families with children already in one of the eleven schools. Note that information collected through the enrolment process is collated on a common database shared by the eleven schools.

Families seeking enrolment should follow the steps below to apply by Thursday 23 May 2024.

Application Process

- 1. Contact/visit the website of the school/s you are interested in enrolling your child at see school list overleaf.
- 2. Engage with the school's process for conducting information sessions or school tours
- 3. Complete the online Expression of Interest for Enrolment form by Thursday 23 May 2024 by visiting the DOBCEL website (click link or scan the QR code)

Important:

- You will be asked to indicate your first, second and third preference schools.
- You will be required to upload your child's Birth Certificate and Baptism Certificate (if applicable).
- If you are unable to access the online form, contact Danielle enrollments@dobcel.catholic.edu.au for assistance. Your query will be attended to as soon as possible.

Enhancing Catholic School Identity

General instructions for survey completion for parents

Thank you very much for making time to participate in the Enhancing Catholic School Identity project. The purpose of this survey research is to gain meaningful insights into how your son or daughter's school views its Catholic identity today and how such identity might be shaped for tomorrow.

Everyone's input is important.

Your participation should take about **55 minutes.** It's best to finish the survey in one shot, without having to come back later.

Your responses are anonymous and your personal data is treated confidentially in accordance with ethical and legal guidelines.

Only you will be able to view your individual results and this can be done once you've completed the questionnaires.

Keep these best practices in mind:

- ✓ **Answer spontaneously and don't overanalyse.** Your input is more valuable if you respond with the first thought that comes to mind. Plus, you'll proceed faster.
- ✓ **Choose the response that honestly matches your opinion.** Don't hesitate to select "strongly agree" or "strongly disagree" if that's in fact how you feel.
- ✓ **Respond as best you can to each question as it is worded.** You may feel that some questions don't fully apply to your school environment. That's OK; just respond as best you can.

It's also helpful to keep in mind:

- ✓ Many questions ask you for two perspectives:
 - o "My son/daughter's school" as you actually see things today
 - o "My ideal school" as you would like to see things in the best future scenario
- ✓ **Some questions might seem repetitive; but they're actually not.** There's a scientific purpose behind the ways in which the questions are formulated. Every question counts.
- ✓ Trust that the survey as a whole will accurately capture your personal point of view. Even if you struggle to respond to some individual questions, it's important to complete the entire survey.

LOGIN INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Access the surveys at www.ecsi.site/au/user/
- 2. Enter the case-sensitive password Ghj654 and click login.



3. If you're a new user: Click the **New user** button.

If you wish to continue a previous session: Enter your User-ID and Password.

- Enter your school's Survey Access Code as provided by your school so that your input will be linked to your school St Thomas More survey access code - d18zWF
- You are now logged in. Displayed on the screen is your unique User-ID and Password (casesensitive).

Save this information (write, print, or email it) to access the website at a later time.



6. From this point forward, please follow the on-screen instructions to complete the surveys.

SURVEY PROGRESS

- The survey begins with some general demographic questions.
- The survey proceeds in several parts. Please finish one part before proceeding to the next one.
- You can view your results at any time by returning to the main questionnaire page.
- You can return at any time to a question and change your response.
- If you wish to pause and finish the survey at a later time, you will need your User-ID and Password in order to login again.
