INFORM AND EMPOWER

This term we continue our partnership with the Inform and Empower Cyber Safety & Digital Wellbeing program. This means that your child/children will be tuning in to live streamed incursions (with their teachers) that focus on healthy and safe digital habits. The incursion content is written and delivered by qualified teachers who are endorsed



by the eSafety Commissioner as a Trusted eSafety Provider. These sessions aim to help children better navigate the online world and become more aware, clever, brave and kind. They will focus on topics including navigating unwanted contact, cyberbullying, help-seeking strategies, unsafe content, balancing screen time with "green time" and guidelines around sharing personal information. You will also be given resources to support conversations with your children at home. You will receive a concise "tip sheet" each term that outlines what your child learned about in their online class.

WINTER UNIFORM

This term we will be trialling a new approach to our winter uniform. Students will have the following uniform options:

Sports uniform - students may choose to wear shorts, skorts or tracksuit pants **Academic uniform** - students may choose to wear their winter pinafore with white school socks or navy tights. Students may also choose to wear grey shorts or grey pants.

A reminder that when wearing the academic uniform, the school jumper is the next layer. Students can wear the soft-shell jacket or the puffer jacket over the jumper. We encourage parents and students to make common sense decisions on which uniform to wear depending on the weather conditions. This change will be reviewed at the end of Term 2 before a decision is made for Term 3.

BEFORE SCHOOL CARE AT 'THE Y'

A Before School Care program, based out of Alfredton Primary School, has begun this term. This service is in conjunction with the After School Care program that is already on offer. The program is designed to provide a safe and engaging environment for children before the school day starts. The service will run from 6:30am to 8:45am each school morning.
