FATHER'S DAY EVENTS



Engaging in regular physical activities can play a key role in influencing children to learn self-control, face challenges, regulate emotions and take manageable risks. In this Special Report, fathers will learn about the positive impact they can have on their child's mental health and wellbeing, whilst also ensuring they indulge in a little self-care.


