FINAL DAY FOR STUDENTS 2025



LITERACY LEARNING AT ST THOMAS MORE 2026 AND BEYOND.

In 2025, St Thomas More Catholic Primary School joined all Catholic Primary Schools across the Ballarat Diocese looking into research and evidence- based literacy practices and approaches that best support the growth of our students. The DOBCEL Flare Literacy Strategy has been implemented in the Ballarat Diocese and is an approach to literacy instruction that applies a systematic, cumulative, explicit and diagnostic methodology to teaching phonology (the system of sounds within our language), sound-symbol relationships, syllables, morphology (the study of words and their parts), syntax (the arrangement of words within sentences) and semantics (the study of meaning in language) from Foundation to Year 6.

As we ready ourselves and our students to move into 2026, we will implement the structures and strategies to support this approach to literacy instruction. This change in our approach means that we will not require classroom helpers during literacy time. Rigorous professional learning was provided throughout 2025 and will continue to be provided for all teachers throughout 2026. In Foundation to Yr 2 classrooms, we will be using a systematic synthetic phonics program (SSPP) as part of literacy learning. After careful deliberation and research, we have chosen UFLI Foundations as our SSPP.

An information session for parents will be held on **Thursday, January 29th, 2026, 5.00pm-6.30pm**. The focus of the session will be on what literacy learning at St Thomas More looks like, with a particular focus on the F-2 classrooms.





As the end of the year approaches, the F-2 students and teachers would like to thank the wonderful parents and grandparents from our school community who have assisted us this year. You have all been absolutely fantastic and we have really appreciated your time, energy and help.

We will be hosting an afternoon tea on Monday, 8th December, at 2:30pm in the staff room to thank you. Week 8 (this week) will also be the last week that classes will need helpers.

Thank you again to those fabulous volunteers who have assisted us with literacy sessions this year.

'Students today have extremely busy schedules, with ever increasing responsibilities at school and at home. Many kids, especially adolescents, are going to bed later and later and are at risk of sleep deprivation. This affects three areas of a child's development: psychological, physiological and psychosocial. All three are essential to a child's growth, learning ability and overall wellbeing. Sleep

is vital to a child's overall development and is as important as diet and exercise. Sleep also strengthens a child's immune systems and supports their ability to function properly on a daily basis. Children who do not get enough sleep show increased levels of aggressive behaviour, are less attentive and are much less active. Trying to catch up on sleep on weekends is not the answer and can still lead to severe sleep deprivation.
